Thank you for sharing our joy with Christmas as we once again bring you this much anticipated holiday lights show. Your encouraging compliments and multiple visits are two of the reasons our dedicated volunteers are excited about continuing to provide this event.

We have grown exponentially over these twelve years, so we needed more warehouse room, or as we call it, workshop space, since we are some of Santa's elves. Thankfully, the Sheboygan Humane Society, our landlord, had space available right next door. A little construction gave us a pass-through from the existing section to the new. Our very organized shop manager, John Muehlbauer, and others on the production committee, rearranged everything to utilize the space efficiently.

A few new displays again this year are a mega star and a jolly hippopotamus, inspired from the age-old children's song "I Want a Hippopotamus for Christmas." I will remain as the fundraising chair but will turn the remainder of duties over to David Hoffman, who is known by many of you. He has long time experience in both the business and non-profit world and will be a great successor to this position. I trust he will be shown the same love and respect that has been demonstrated to me over the years.

There aren't adequate words to thank all who have worked so diligently with me since 2010 when this concept was but an idea brought back from a Rotary District Conference by Judy Slawny and myself. It became a reality in 2012 and has become more than we could ever have imagined. We wouldn't be continuing year after year without the visitors who frequent the park with their pantry and monetary donations. Our partnership with Sheboygan County Food Bank has been rewarding beyond words and with the addition of the annual 5K Holiday Lights Run/Walk has afforded them increased

benefits. Lastly, but certainly not least, I would like to thank all of our families who have supported our efforts, supporting the time required to bring this special event to fruition annually.

It has been a gratifying, rewarding experience and I look forward to what is ahead with new leadership.

CAN I WALK THROUGH THE PARK?

Evergreen Park's drive thru route made it the optimal choice for the Making Spirits Bright event. For safety reasons, we aren't able to allow visitors to walk the route at the same time. But, Holiday Lights Hunger Run/Walk is your opportunity to do that.

WILL THE PARK BE CLOSED IN INCLEMENT WEATHER?

Making Spirits Bright will be open despite rain or snow, unless there is a declared snow emergency. Please watch social media, the web site, and local media to confirm if it becomes necessary to close.

DO I NEED TO BE AN ELECTRICIAN OR HAVE OTHER SPECIFIC SKILLS TO HELP CONSTRUCT DISPLAYS?

Volunteers don't need to have special skills/ training to construct displays or handle many of the other tasks needed to make the event a success. We are always happy to find a job that you will be excited about and feel comfortable doing.

WHEN DOES THE PLANNING FOR MAKING SPIRITS BRIGHT BEGIN EACH YEAR?

Believe it or not, committee members take a mere two weeks off in January and then begin focusing on enhancing the coming year's event in early February.

HOW MANY COOKIES ARE BAKED EACH YEAR IN THE VOLUNTEER TRAILER?

Each year about 144 dozen are baked so park volunteers can enjoy warm loving from the oven.

CAN I HAVE MY PICTURE TAKEN WITH SANTA AT QUARRYVIEW CENTER?

We encourage you and your family or friends to visit with Santa on the nights Quarryview is open. We aren't able to have a photographer on hand but feel free to bring your own camera and capture photo memories.

HOW MANY POUNDS OF PANTRY ITEMS HAVE BEEN COLLECTED TO DATE?

Almost a million pounds.





ALMOST 1 MILLION POUNDS AND COUNTING OF FOOD FOR LOCAL FAMILIES

The 12-year Making Spirits Bright and Sheboygan County Food Bank partnership is a special collaboration that helps make sure nutritious food and other basic necessities reach local families in need. Both organizations recruit volunteers to collect non-perishable food and personal care items from visitors and deliver the donations to Sheboygan County Food Bank's warehouse every night during Making Spirits Bright.

About 989,000 pounds of donations have been collected since the event started in 2012. This means that as a community, we're on track to collect over 1 million pounds of food in 2023!

Making Spirits Bright has also provided a grand total of \$155,000 to Sheboygan County Food Bank over the years:

- \$10,000 to help purchase a box truck and lift gate
- \$25,000 to buy diapers and healthy food items
- \$35,000 for a refrigerated truck to increase fresh food donations and deliveries
- \$10,000 to purchase healthy, emergency food during the COVID-19 pandemic
- \$30,000 to purchase most-needed, healthy food items
- \$20,000 to purchase food and personal care items, and to support Food for Thought for Kids and the Herb Kohler and Natalie Black Community Cafe
- \$25,000 in general support

"Making Spirits Bright donations are always critical for stocking our shelves during the holiday season. Donations are especially important in 2023 as inflation is keeping the cost of living high and decreases in government support are making it difficult for low-and-middle-income families to put food on the table. Sheboygan County Food Bank distributes food through its core programs, Food+ for Neighbors, Food for Thought for Kids, the Herb Kohler and Natalie Black Community Cafe, and Sheboygan Cares Food Pantry, in partnership with 21 food pantries and dozens of other organizations in Sheboygan County.





Become a subscriber; give a gift to a Veteran or to the special someone who has everything. For a tax deductible contribution of \$75 annually, members of the Rotary Club install a PVC sleeve in the soil below the grass mowing level in your front yard. A 3' x 5' flag will be delivered 3 days prior to a holiday and retrieved 3 days after the last holiday in the group. Examples are Memorial Day until Independence Day; Labor Day until after 9/11; and Election Day until Veterans Day. This schedule provides extended periods of time to enjoy the flag. Worn Flags will be routinely replaced.



VOLUNTEER TRAILER RECEIVES MUCH NEEDED REPAIRS

In the second year of operation for Making Spirits Bright, a 53-foot retired semi-trailer was gifted to the organization. After extensive construction and furnishing, it provided a place for volunteers to enjoy refreshments, take a break, and warm up when the weather warranted it. The trailer is outfitted with a stove, refrigerator and a furnace; along with benches for seating.

The years of transporting it back and forth from the park and workshop impacted it so recently the brakes failed. The roof was leaking rather seriously due to



years of use. We are thrilled to report that both have been repaired thanks to two very generous businesses.

Special thanks to Fischer's Fleet Service of Sheboygan for repairing the brakes and suspension air valve and SRJJ Truck and Auto also of Sheboygan for solving the roof leak. Both provided the work at a great reduction in cost. Before these companies stepped up to help, the greatest fear was the need to start from square one with a different trailer and begin the build process all over again. Our newly enhanced trailer will provide many more years of service to the event volunteers.







2022 EVENT SUCCESS RESULTS IN \$25,000 DONATION TO FIGHT LOCAL HUNGER

Thanks to generous visitors to 2022 Making Spirits Bright, the board of directors for the event made a decision to contribute \$25,000 to Sheboygan County Food Bank. This was in addition to the primary goal of the event which is to collect food pantry donations. Closing in on one million pounds of non-perishable food and personal care items have been collected since the start of the lights show in 2012.



The monetary donation came at a critical time when Sheboygan County Food Bank experienced a decrease from other donation events and needed to purchase food to provide for local people requesting help. The combination of record high inflation and decreases in government support mean low and middle income people are seeking more assistance.

Overall \$155,000 in monetary contributions have been given over the past eleven years from the Making Spirits Bright event to Sheboygan County Food Bank. Thank you generous visitors to the lights show, and please keep up your high-level of food pantry item donations and cash contributions.

A park captain serves as the person in charge each night. He or she arrives about 4:00 PM to prepare the volunteer trailer as the welcoming place for that night's volunteers. As the 8-12 volunteers from businesses and organizations arrive about 4:30 PM, they head to the trailer to put on reflective vests, get flashlights as needed, and grab a beverage.

The excitement begins at 5:00 PM when the lights go on and the music streams over the dedicated radio setting.

At 9:00 PM when the show ends, the Sheboygan County Food Bank's truck is driven to the warehouse for sorting and storage of the pantry item donations. The volunteers head home and the park captain secures the area.



MEGA STAR DEBUTS THIS YEAR FOR INCREDIBLE WOW FACTOR

The inspiration for the newest display, the Mega Star, came from the movie "Christmas Chronicles 2." Greg Liebig, long-time chair of the production committee, designed it using the innovative software Fusion 360. An in-house CNC router and plasma machine created the tool paths and cut all major components. The structural components are made from steel and the spires are aluminum. Fabrication and assembly for the structure and trailer were done by Tom Shircel and Mark Hayon, also members of the production committee. The lights were installed by production crew volunteers and the testing and final wiring was handled by Rich Neerhof. While the Mega Star was going to have more spires, due to supply shortages, the necessary controllers were unavailable. This 3-D Mega Star is over 20 feet tall, 18 feet wide, and weighs about 450 pounds. It's lit with about 2,800 RGB fully programmable lights and is an awesome addition to the show.
